BEING A BY-LAW OF THE TOWN OF BEAUSEJOUR PROVIDING FOR THE
REGULATION OF LOITERING AND PUBLIC NUISANCES.

WHEREAS Section 232(1) of *The Municipal Act* states in part as follows:

232(1) A Council may pass by-laws for municipal purposes respecting the following matters:

- (b) people, activities and things in, on or near a public place or a place open to the public, including parks, municipal roads, recreation centres, restaurants, facilities, retail stores, malls and private clubs and facilities that are exempt from municipal taxation.

AND WHEREAS it is desirable and in the best interests of the Town of Beausejour to establish regulations for deterring of loitering and public nuisances in the Town of Beausejour.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the Town of Beausejour, in open meeting duly assembled enacts as follows:

1. "Loitering" means to linger idly in a public place and in any way obstructs persons who are in that place.
2. "Nuisance" means to cause a disturbance by screaming, shouting, swearing, singing or using insulting or obscene language or by impeding or molesting other persons.
3. THAT no person shall by any manner or conduct commit any public nuisance by collecting, loitering, or standing as idlers, on any of the streets or sidewalks of the Town of Beausejour, or on the steps of, or approach to, a house or other premises open to the public street, whereby the public are liable to be subjected to disturbance or annoyance.
4. THAT any person who contravenes the provisions set out in this by-law shall, for each offence, be liable upon summary conviction to a fine of not less than \$100.00 and not greater than \$300.00 plus costs. Each contravention of this by-law shall be deemed to be a separate offence.
